- If you have an alarm system at your residence, please use it. Secure your doors, windows and vehicle(s). Do not leave keys or valuables in your vehicle. Remember, thieves are looking for opportunity.
- If you observe suspicious activity, notify the police immediately. It only takes a few minutes for the police to check a suspicious person or vehicle.
- With warmer weather here, be mindful of your speed and children playing. Also watch for pedestrians and cyclists in the area.
- Be cautious of telephone and internet scams. In these economic times, criminals are looking to access your money anyway possible. "If it sounds too good to be true, it is".
- Please contact the police department if you have any questions or concerns.
- Pets Please be considerate of your neighbors. Waite Hill Village has ordinances which pertain to barking dogs and animals running at large. You are responsible to keep your pets under control at all times.
