## MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF WAITE HILL, OHIO

December 9, 2019

Pursuant to notice given, the Council of the Village of Waite Hill, Ohio, met at the Waite Hill Village Hall at 8:18 a.m. on Monday, December 9, 2019, with Mayor Robert A. Ranallo presiding.

The minutes of a Regular Meeting of Council, as Amended, held November 11, 2019, had previously been distributed to Council. It was suggested that Council had reached a consensus that the administration's interpretation of the Village's zoning code, as applied to property owners in the Creawood subdivision was correct: the use of a residence in Waite Hill as an Airbnb is not consistent with the permitted use of the property for a "one-family detached dwelling." It was agreed that the November minutes will be amended to reflect this consensus. Mr. Knezevic moved to approve the minutes as amended, which motion was seconded by Mr. Gale.

On behalf of the Communication and Community Outreach Committee Marcia Merritt reported that the newsletter will go out in January. She also reports that the Book Club was very well attended. There will be no meeting of the Book Club in December in light of the holidays.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, Mr. Scheucher reported that the Committee had followed its usual agenda. The minutes and Treasurer's Report were approved, and the Village has received its rollback reimbursement from the state. It was noted that the Health District's charges went up. It was also noted that, on average, the Village continued to have a deficit position of about three hundred eighty seven thousand dollars (\$387,000) per year, for the same reasons that had been previously discussed. The purchase and sale of securities, as recommended by Ancora, had been ratified. There was a discussion on what the impact of changing the density of the Village's zoning would have on the Village's revenues. He also noted that the Compensation Committee had met and the recommendations will be discussed during the executive session.

Mr. Knezevic reported that the Planning and Zoning Commission had not met in November and therefore he had nothing to report.

Mr. Taplin had nothing specific to report on behalf of the Safety Committee and deferred to Chief DeWitt. Chief DeWitt reported an increase in activity that the department is seeing. There was a discussion regarding mutual aid issues that have arisen and possible solutions to these issues.

On behalf of the Service Committee, Mr. Gale deferred to Mr. Haynik for a report. Mr. Haynik reported that it has been quiet, and that the department is waiting and ready for the winter snow season to begin.

Mr. Gale then moved to adjourn to executive session to discuss the compensation of Village Employees, which motion was seconded by Mr. Knezevic.
