From the Office of the Mayor

Hello Residents.

As the world, our country and our State continue to quickly evolve in the face of daily developments on the COVID-19 front, it is beyond evident that we as a society are ready to



re-emerge into a world that offers hope for a return to some sort of normalcy (whatever that may mean to you) and engagement with others, and daily lives free of some of the restrictions that have limited us since the onset of this thing called the coronavirus. One need look no further than this past Memorial Day weekend where our nation encountered record numbers of travelers, packed parks and beaches, a return to sporting events and other public gatherings not seen for over a year. Indeed, what a 15 months it has been.

We at Village Hall have adapted, recommencing in-person meetings of Council, Planning and Zoning and Architectural Board of Review, albeit with masks, social distancing and observance of other CDC guidelines. Also, in accordance with CDC and State of Ohio guidelines, we reopened Village Hall to the public on June 2.

Some of the more noteworthy happenings around the Village are described below.

All Good Things Must Come to an End: A Retirement

It is with mixed emotions that I announce the retirement of long-serving Police Chief Keith DeWitt. Chief and I have been in discussions for over a year about his pending retirement, and fortunately, he has paved the way with a most capable successor in Lieutenant Carl Dondorfer.

No amount of words can describe Keith's contributions to this Village. He led by example and consistently displayed a sense of service, devotion and commitment to its residents. Keith was a problem solver who took on the most daunting of challenges, setting a tone of professionalism, excellence, service and humility in all he did. We hate to lose him. At the same time, we are gratified that Keith will be able to enjoy a retirement that he so diligently earned.

As mentioned in our last newsletter, Keith's successor Carl Dondorfer brings a long and distinguished career in law enforcement, having served in various roles at the Lake County Sheriff's Department, Lake Metroparks Ranger Department, and the Willoughby Municipal Court. Carl is also a graduate of the FBI Academy, and we are fortunate to have him join the Department.

Chief DeWitt's last day will be June 30th. Please make it a point if you see him to thank him for his service. We are all better off because of it. At the same time, congratulate Lieutenant Dondorfer and welcome him to his new role.

Markell Road Bridge

Work on Markell Road bridge began last month and is scheduled to continue through the end of November. This has resulted in road closures and alternate routing of traffic patterns while the work progresses.

The Kirtland school system, Willoughby, Willoughby Hills, Kirtland and other neighboring police, fire and safety forces have all been informed of the road closure and made appropriate adjustments. In addition, those engaging in construction projects and their contractors should be notified of the need to re-route themselves to conform to the limitations and restrictions.

We will keep you informed of any intervening developments as they occur.

Paving Projects

As we have previously communicated, we typically do not engage in paving projects without a major funding contribution from the Ohio Public Works Commission. We were not awarded any funding for road projects in 2021. Accordingly, we do not anticipate any road projects this summer. We will continue our customary maintenance and crack sealing programs in an effort to lengthen the useful lives of our existing streets and roads.

Building Projects

We have seen an unprecedented level of activity in new homes, additions and improvement projects proposed in the Village this year. The Architectural Board of Review and Planning and Zoning have (continued next page)

been very active reviewing and evaluating new construction projects and we expect four to six new homes to be completed over the next year.

Please remember that before undertaking any project that includes the building of a new structure (whether a primary residence or an accessory structure) or an alteration to the exterior appearance of an existing structure, prior approval from the Architectural Board of Review is required. Please call Robbi Laps at Village Hall who will outline the approval procedure for you.

Waite Hill Upper and Lower Preserve Work

As many already know, Western Reserve Land Conservancy owns 385 acres of land in the Village, largely as a result of a merger with Waite Hill Land Conservancy in 2012. Conservation easements protect the properties in perpetuity as nature preserves, and the Land Conservancy spends considerable time and resources managing the properties for birds and other wildlife, scenic views for the community, education, research, and other permitted uses.

There will be a good amount of work that takes place this summer and fall by the Conservancy at the 185-acre Lower Preserve on the west side of Smith Road. A new driveway will be installed to improve access to the property and facilitate the property's maintenance and upkeep.

The Land Conservancy will also be doing work over the next few years on the 60-acre Sherwin Bird Sanctuary parcel located on the east side of Smith Road. That work will include the removal of most of the non-native invasive vines, shrubs, and small trees north and south of the upper pond as visible from the road, with the area to be cleared and restored with flowering pollinator plants. This will promote a higher quality habitat for birds, butterflies, and other wildlife and reduce the spread of invasive species to surrounding properties.

Finally, the Land Conservancy is hoping to host a hike at the Sherwin Preserve for residents in the fall, so check your mailbox later this year for details.

Volunteers Needed


