
From the Office of the Mayor

Changes in the Service Department

After over 30 years of dedicated work as a member of the Village's Service Department, Brian Miller stepped into a life of retirement in June. Finding a capable substitute for Brian and his years of experience can be challenging, but we were fortunate to come upon Austyn Richards. Austyn comes to us with a broad range of experience that will enable him to make immediate contributions to the Service Department. Metcalf Road

We completed the paving of Metcalf Road in August. Initially, we were going to limit our work to the deteriorated sections that showed the most wear and tear based on an analysis conducted by our Village engineer; however, after receiving the bids, it was decided to pave the entire road since the cost was significantly less than our engineer's estimate. That made our decision an easy one and increased the life expectancy of the road now that it is fully paved.

Bridge Update

You have undoubtedly noticed that many of the bridges in the Village were recently resurfaced. Maintenance of these bridges is the sole responsibility of the Lake County Engineer's office. That office has recently changed its maintenance program for bridge surfaces from an asphalt surfacing to a chip sealing.

And speaking of bridges, replacement of the Waite Hill Road and the Markell Road bridges are still scheduled for 2020 and 2021. We will keep you informed as construction activities in this regard are solidified.

Village Communications

We are increasingly relying on email to communicate with our residents. If you want to be kept informed, it is becoming more and more critical that you register your email addresses with Robbi Laps at Village Hall so that all communications can be timely delivered to you. Having current emails for all residents is a matter that involves public safety, Village emergencies and regular activities. So, if you have not already done so, please get those email addresses to Robbi, sooner being better than later.

The Waite Hill Police Beat



Hello to all residents.

Now that summer is about gone, and the dreaded winter months are just around the corner, please remind your snow plow service that pushing snow across the street when plowing your driveway is unacceptable. The build-up of snow on the roads causes hazardous driving conditions. We will be citing the operators if our officers observe this type of plowing activity.

We all have to remember to be aware of pedestrian traffic. Our Village has had an increase in traffic over the years, causing a few incidents of crashes and near misses with pedestrians. We are trying to be diligent with the speeding vehicles on our roadways. Please contact us with any areas of concern that you may have.

The school year has started, which means school buses are out on the roads. Drivers need to be aware of children at bus stops. When you are on the road, be mindful of school bus activity and children crossing the streets.

Drivers should also maintain a safe distance when driving behind school buses. Be aware that the yellow flashing lights mean the bus is coming to a stop, while the red flashing lights mean children are getting on and off that big yellow taxi.

We have received a few complaints about golf carts being operated by children on the Village roadways. These types of vehicles are not permitted to be operated on our roadways, adults and children alike. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me or anyone else at the Police Department. Deer season is approaching fast, and they are already on the move throughout the Village. Unfortunately, the deer are not too traffic "savvy" and think they own the roads. Please be extra careful when driving. Also, we are aware of the coyote issues, and I am working with our hunters to assist us with keeping the population down.

Our officers continue to obtain signatures for our "Unwanted Visitors" list, as each resident has the opportunity to make this decision for their property. Those who **do not** sign the form will be placed on a list of persons who **do not object** to uninvited visitors coming on to their property for canvassing purposes. Anyone canvassing for commercial reasons must register with the Village and will be issued this list. Canvassers who want to speak to individuals regarding non-commercial matters (candidates for political office, ballot issues, religion, etc.) are not required to register and will be notified of Village ordinances and receive this list if seen in the Village.

Please remember, if you notice anything that does not look right or looks suspicious, please contact us. The best way to reach an officer is through the dispatcher at (440)942-1660. If it is an emergency, please call 9-1-1.

The Waite Hill Village Police Department, as always, looks forward to serving the community. Your safety and security are our top concern!
